Getting Ready in Case of Wildfire

This document is to help you have the information needed as we ready ourselves and our properties for the threat of a wildfire: the steps and links for reporting a fire, evacuating your home, reducing risk on your property, monitoring area fires, assembling Grab & Go bags, and other resources.

To Report a Fire & Alert Neighbors

ACTION	Prepare NOW & Be Ready	Additional Info
Call 911	Keep cell phone with you. Carry fire extinguisher & water in car.	
If needed, ODF	Emergency number 541-935-2283 x1 (other business is x5)	Usually just call 911
Honk car horn 4x, pause, 4x to alert neighbors	Notify neighbors that you will do this.	
Send Message to Local Neighborhood Group	Become part of emergency messaging with local neighborhood group members. Contact your group leader. For Leaders contact list: Log in to SBNA.net, copy and paste this link into the URL address bar: https://sbnaorna.samariteam.com/DocFetcher.ashx?FolderItemId=39322	
Help neighbors who need assistance	Know if any neighbors have health or mobility issues that would make it difficult to escape.

Vehicle is ready	Maintain gas level at least half full, carry water & fire extinguisher (or ball)	Maybe also shovel
Grab & Go Bag is ready	Pack a Grab & Go bag for each family member + pets. Attach a list of what you can only pack at the last minute.	See Page 6 – Grab & Go bags

Identify all possible evacuation routes	 Work with neighbors & local group to create and maintain alternate exits in case primary exit is not available because of fire. Plan for farm animals	Develop a plan for farm animals.	
Have what you need ready to go	Assemble anything you are taking with you if you need to evacuate in a readily accessible location or in the car. Have pet carriers handy. Keep pets inside if you might need to evacuate.	See Page 6 – Grab & Go bags
Determine post-fire needs	Determine what you would need after a fire. Ask insurance company what they would require. Photos? Can you send them now? Family photos – send digital copies to friends/relatives out of the area? Other documentation needed? Valuables you could not take in evacuation?

Chainsaw use is <u>Restricted</u>. When allowed, each saw being used must have one shovel and one fire extinguisher of at least 8 ounce capacity. Cutting, Grinding, and Welding of Metal is <u>Restricted</u>. When allowed, the work area must be cleared of flammable materials and have either a charged hose or 2 ½ pound or larger fire extinguisher available. Mowing/Cutting of Dried, Cured Grass is <u>Restricted</u>. The cultivation and harvest of agricultural crops is exempt from this requirement.	Allowed All Day	Allowed Before 1pm and after 8pm	Allowed Before 10am and after 8pm	Not Allowed
Off-road Motorized Vehicle use is <u>Restricted</u>. All vehicles, including motorcycles and all-terrain vehicles, operating on unimproved roads and areas that contain flammable vegetation are restricted to the listed times. Any other spark-emitting internal combustion engine is <u>Restricted</u> . Grab & Go Bag – One for Each Member of the Household + Pets

Pack items into a backpack or rolling suitcase & store it where you can grab it fast. Attach list of last minute additions.

Contact info for family, friends, neighbors, emergency services		
Change of clothing, sturdy shoes, blanket – preferably wool		
Extra set of car keys, credit cards, cash		
First aid kit		
Flashlight & extra batteries		
Whistle (to signal for help)		
Sanitation & personal hygiene supplies including moist towelettes, garbage bags, plastic ties		
Copies of important documents (birth certificates, passports, medication list, proof of address, deed/lease to home, insurance policies, proof of vaccination)		
Items to take if time allows:		
Easily carried valuablesFamily photos and other irreplaceable items		
Pet Bag: Food, water, extra collar, leash, ID, food, carrier, bowls, medications		

Carry in Vehicle Throughout Fire Season:

- Fire extinguisher at least a 2.5 lb.
- Water
- Portable shovel
- Wire cutters
